# President's Report

- Introduction of current board members
- 2022 Year in Review
  - Continued traditional landscaping scope.
  - Continued common pathway snow removal scope.
  - Continued diligence on graffiti control and illegal signage
  - Refurbished the "Springborough" sign
  - Limited interaction with Springbank Hill Community Association (SBHCA) and Griffith Woods School. No notable interaction with Ernest Manning, Ambrose and Springborough Professional Centre.
  - Continued emphasis on collections.

## Landscaping Report

- Continued with Foothills. Board is pleased with results as they did a very good job and were responsive to any issues or concerns.
- Similar services to 2021, including watering and weed control
- City replaced some trees but not all.
- Continued with Arbutus for winter snow removal. Overall good service although there were a few examples where snow removal was not up to our standards. These were quickly addressed by Arbutus. Price increase was reasonable.
- Looking to paint the Springborough sign in the next month or two.
- Refurbishment of "Springborough" sign.
- Plans for 2023
  - Cancel snow removal due to contractual arrangements required with City of Calgary and due to reassessment of potential liabilities to Association
  - Anticipate continuing with Foothills for 2023; only single year contract.
  - Scope the same, with review of hours/work done to assess pricing for 2024 and beyond

#### Financial Report

- Reviewed 2021 financial statements. Similar results to prior years for standard scope of work. General update on 2022 YTD.
